A SIMPLE WAY TO GROW OUR CHURCH

There is a simple way to grow our church. It is something that can be done by a congregation of any size. It can be done in any geographic area. It can be done by a congregation with an average age of 29 and by a congregation with an average age of 79. What is it? **Have more first-time guests!**

Even if our church does not improve its hospitality, guest follow-up, worship service, discipleship program or facilities, which we are doing, our church will do better if we can multiply the number of first-time guests three-fold or four-fold. If we do improve one or more of those areas, our efforts will be even more successful.

Notice that I said this was a simple way to grow our church, not an easy way to grow our church. It will likely take significant work in order to have three or four times as many local first-time guests as are currently coming. This may take people in the church inviting their friends and associates, improving the church web site (take a look at our new site www.christumcutah.net), getting the church involved in social media (such as FaceBook), investing in advertising, stopping some activities in order to focus on those more likely to reach new people, changing the way in which the pastor invests her time, engaging in Servant Evangelism (hold the weekend of Oct 14-15 for Great Days of Service) , tweaking existing programs (such as Vacation Bible School) and keeping a much closer eye on certain key metrics.

Our church can do this. Our church council has chosen to move in this direction. Lets join the churches across the country which have made the decision to do what it takes in order to

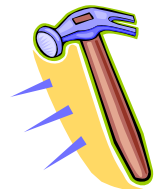

JUST FAITH, Invitation to a journey.

JustFaith provides a lively and challenging format in which to be formed by the faith tradition that changes lives, inspires faithful witness, and transforms the world through love and service. Across the country, JustFaith has proven to be a potent and successful strategy for expanding and energizing personal commitment to address human suffering.

JustFaith participants get involved in their communities at home and around the world to work for change and to be the hands and feet of God, working to feed those who hunger and thirst for a better life. Participants are also afforded the privilege of becoming community with other participants and sharing a journey of faith and compassion that changes lives, inspires faithful witness, and transforms the world through love and service. The JustFaith program has been powerful to both those participants who had never encountered social ministry as well as participants who have long histories in the work of social ministry.

JustFaith involves groups of about 10-15 people, who meet for 30 weekly sessions, two weekend retreats and four Saturday immersion experiences. Overall, this adult formation process extends over 8 months and uses books, videos, guest speakers, discussion, prayer, retreats, immersion experiences, and community building. Testimonies of participants around the country attest to the personal transformation that happens to people who complete the program.

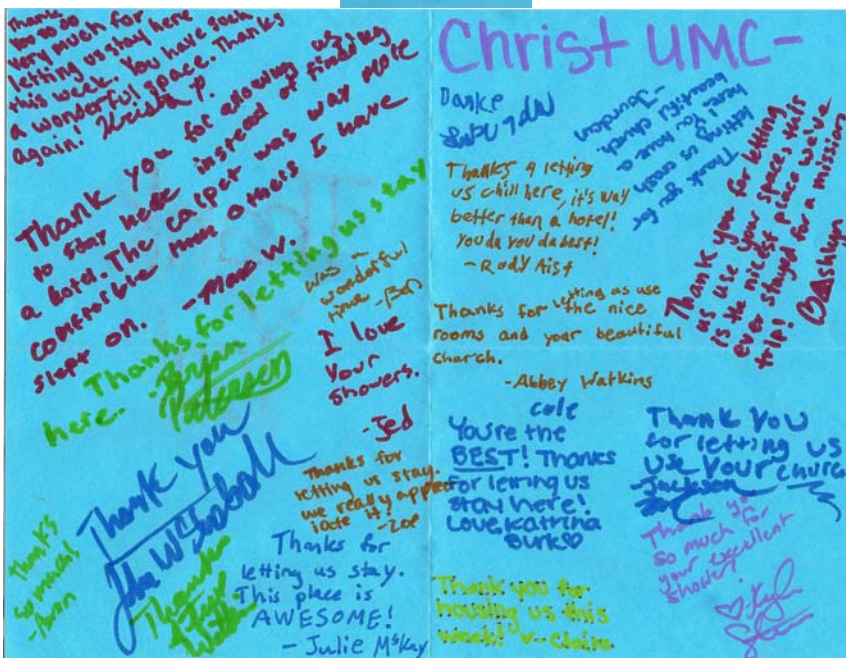

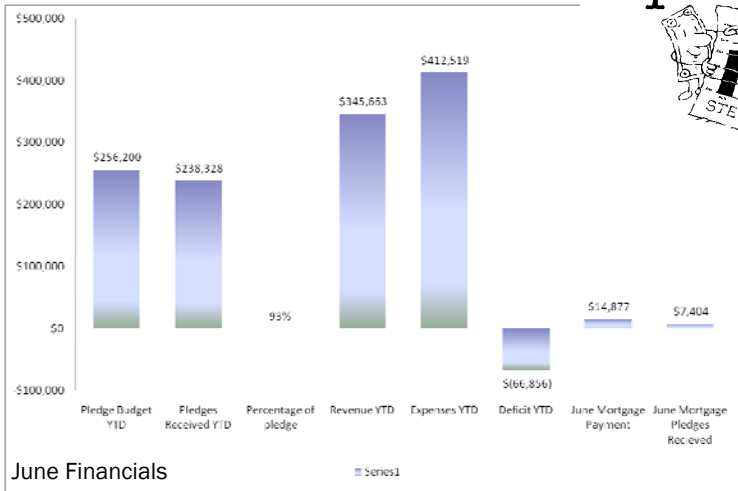
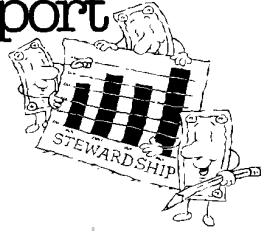

Stewardship Report



A very warm thanks to all of you who made our 2011-2012 pledge drive a success! The good news? Overall, we received pledges increased slightly from last year. The bad news? In spite of across the board cuts of about 17%, our expenses still outpace our income. While we have other income throughout the year, we cannot count on this when planning programs and ministries.

The worse news? Although we started the 21st Century with a nice cushion, the past two years of

deficit budgets have nearly used up our available reserve funds. In the past, we have had times of drought followed by times of plenty, allowing us to maintain healthy reserves. That pattern changed with the economic downturn in 2008, leaving us with continual losses.

I know that God has big plans for our church. Our leaders are looking toward the future, remembering that God calls us to **seek, celebrate, share and serve**. We have many wonderful programs here at Christ Church – programs of outreach, fellowship, worship and celebration. But all of this costs money – a minimum of about \$80,000 each month. Pledged gifts to date cover only about **half** of this amount.

God calls on us all to give generously and joyfully. It is never too late to turn in a pledge or sign up for electronic giving (which you can do through our new website, <http://www.christumcutah.net/giving>). Please don't be the missing piece!

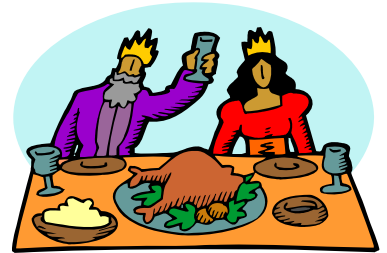
