

Ron's Reflections

With the lighting of the Advent Candle last Sunday the period of waiting and preparation for Christmas has officially begun. Never mind that the stores have been decorated since before Halloween and a couple of radio stations have been playing nothing but seasonal music since the first of November, for the Christian it is Advent that begins the Season.



Like so many events of the Church, Christmas is overlaid with traditions and meanings. It was not one of the earliest Festivals of the Christian Year to be celebrated; that would be Easter and then Pentecost. It was centuries before the Church looked beyond the anticipated return of Jesus to attempt to put his life in chronological order. And, as so many Biblical scholars have written, the early Church didn't know for certain when the birth occurred but for a variety of reasons the date we use, close to the winter equinox, was chosen and has been celebrated ever since.

Christmas comes, for those of us in the Northern Hemisphere, when the days are the shortest, the darkness deepest, and the cold often most bitter. Christmas comes to bring the promise of renewal, brightness to the dark, and joy to the questioning heart.

I am thinking of those of you who will be facing Christmas alone this year. Perhaps it is the realization that this year our house won't be overflowing with 13 energetic souls, 4 dogs, and smells that make me salivate just thinking about them. The traditions of our family will be laid aside this year, and that is okay, because it is our choice to be away from our children and grandchildren so that we might be with you. To be away from loved ones is a choice some of you did not make. But there is good news even here!

Over the past few weeks I have been listening closely to what so many of you have been saying, not just about what you hope for the future but about the reality of the present as well. One of our members who had been away from the church for a number of years came back to worship recently. As she was leaving worship she told me, "I came in and sat down. I looked around. I heard the music of the organ. I saw others, like myself, who had come to worship, and I thought to myself, 'I'm home!'" A younger member, back home for a quick vacation, said, "It is so good to be home. When I'm here I am able to be human again,"

So many of the traditions and the meanings of Christmas are tied to family and for so many of us, this Church, and all of you, are our home and our family. The bonds that so many share here are as close, or closer, than those of brothers or sisters. And my word today is, no matter what your circumstances, Christ Church is your home, and all of us are your family.

This Christmas Season, and all year long, welcome home!

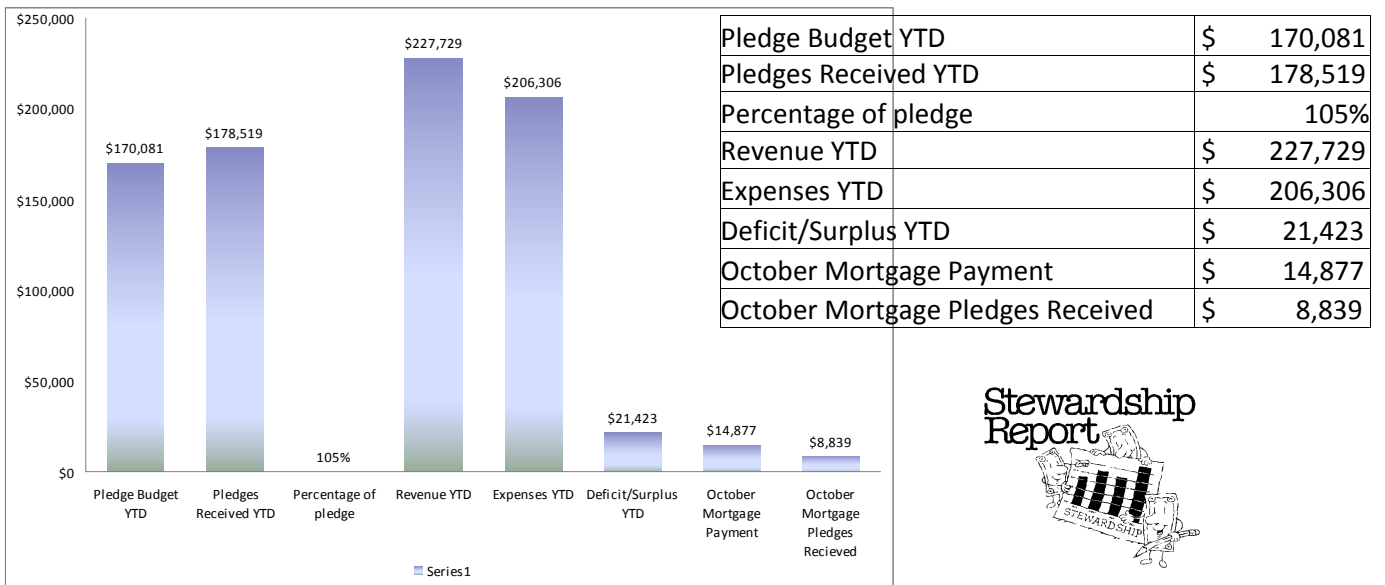
Stewardship Minute

The Enchanted Tree 2011

Since 1989, Christ United Methodist Church has had the opportunity of bearing gifts to honor the birth of the Christ child. Just as the Magi brought their gifts so long ago, we bring our gifts to support the mission of Christ. In remembrance of the story of a bare, lifeless tree made beautiful in the forest by the gifts of love brought by the villagers who passed by it, so a bare tree outside the narthex will once again be transformed into a thing of beauty by the loving gifts of our congregation.

The Mission Work Area has chosen four mission projects for you to consider to receive your gift.

1. **CUMC GOOD SAMARITAN FUND.** This fund, disbursed at the direction of our pastor, serves both members and non-members, with emergency needs.
2. **CROSSROADS URBAN CENTER EMERGENCY FUND.** Crossroads Urban Center is an Institutional Ministry of the United Methodist Church as well as a local project of this church. This fund is used to provide prescriptions, bus tokens, eye-glasses and other assistance. In 2010, Crossroads Emergency Fund spent over \$40,000, directly benefiting people in need.
3. **MISSION WORK TRIPS FOR CUMC YOUTH** Hogar de Ninos Sr High Mexico Mission Trip: July 3-17, 2012. Current 9th-12th graders from Christ UMC spend 2 weeks living, eating, playing with children just outside a small village, Venadillo Our Jr Hi Youth will continue their annual service projects at Pinecliff Camp. All our youth will continue to do local mission projects in the Salt Lake Valley including UMCOR, Angel Tree Prison Ministry, Crossroads Urban Center, Utah Food Bank and assisting elderly families and other families in need with miscellaneous projects in and around their homes.
4. **HAITI** United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is working to strengthen the capacity of the United Methodist church in Haiti to develop the human resources, skills and infrastructure to help Haiti's recovery
5. **OTHER.** If you prefer, you may write-in a project of your choice.

If you would like for your gift to honor or to memorialize someone, mark the appropriate box on the form and write their name and address for honorarium or name for memorial on the back of the form.
