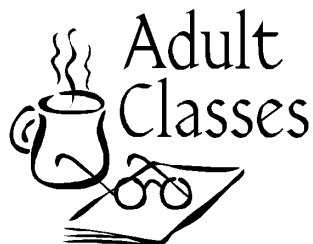
Praise Mountain Worship Leaders Needed

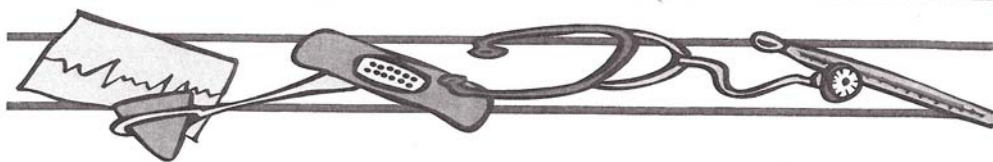

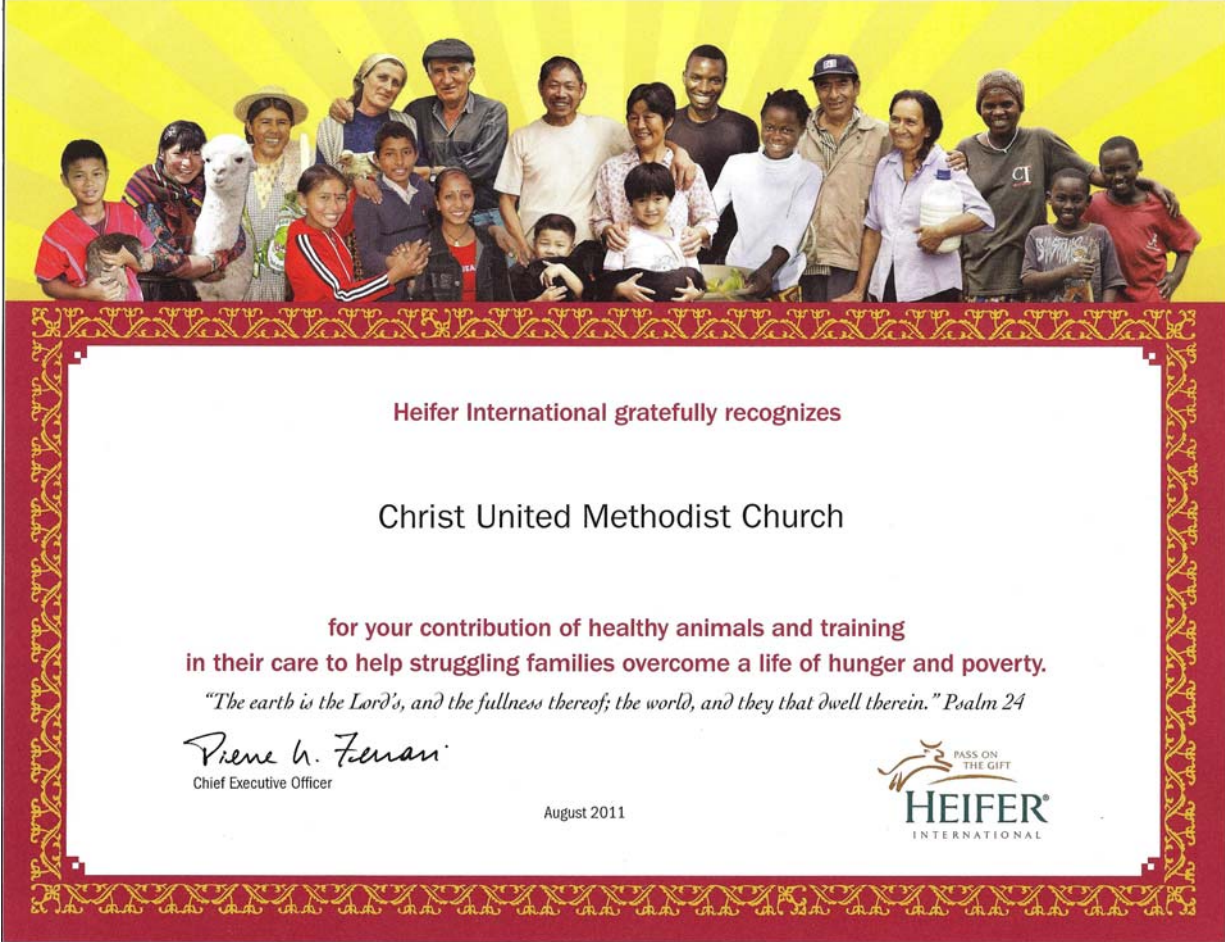

Up With Utah Youth STEP UP

NOVEMBER 2011

Who: Utah United Methodist Youth & Friends grades 6-12

What: Up with Utah Youth

When: Friday, November 4th at 7p - Saturday November 5th at 6p

Where: Christ UMC - 2375 E 3300 S - Salt Lake City, UT 84109

Why: To provide an event for Utah UMC Youth to give them a sense of belonging (we aren't alone) and a sense of purpose (there IS a reason why we are who we are). We gather together to play, learn, worship, grow and serve together to allow us to connect with God and each other.

What to bring:

Overnight items such as sleeping bag, pillow, change of clothes (you'll get a Up with Utah t-shirt at the event), personal hygiene items, medications (give to responsible adult), shoes and clothes for sports tournaments

Collect donations for UMCOR HEALTH KITS from your local churches & neighborhoods:

Hand towels (15" x 25" to 17" x 27, washcloths, sturdy combs at least 8" long (no pocket combs or picks – but rattail combs & combs without handles are acceptable), metal nail files or clippers (no emery boards or toenail clippers), bath size soap bars 3oz and larger, Adult toothbrushes original packaging, band aids, 1 gallon ziplock bags, \$1 bills to purchase toothpaste

Put supplies in **5 gallon buckets with lids** - label with blue tape what's inside the buckets (ie. one for toothbrushes, one for combs , etc.)
